As a sole practitioner since 1985 in Fort Worth, architect, writer, teacher and collector W. Mark Gunderson, AIA searches for insight and meaning in both the poetic and technical aspects of our existence.

He is a past president of both AIA Fort Worth and the Dallas Architectural Foundation and serves on the Advisory Board of the Dallas Architecture Forum, where for 9 years he was Vice-President / Panels and Symposia. Gunderson is a Contributing Editor to *Texas Architect* and a recipient of the John G. Flowers Award from the Texas Society of Architects. He is a Distinguished Alumnus of the Texas Tech University College of Architecture. A co-author to the book *Buildings of Texas, Volume Two* published by the Society of Architectural Historians, he has written many articles for *Texas Architect, Architectural Record, The Architect's*

How do four Pritzker Prize architects design within the humid subtropical climate of Dallas, with summer daytime temperatures often over 100°F. This tour will look at the works of four Pritzker Prize architects during a 1-mile walking tour of downtown Dallas. The tour will include entry to the Nasher Sculpture Center (Piano) and Perot Museum of Nature and Science (Thom Mayne), and a discussion of how outdoor spaces negotiate climate and programmatic issues in the Wyly Theatre (Koolhaas) and Winspear Opera House (Foster). Tour includes entry to Perot and Nasher only, while Wyly and Winspear will be experienced from outside.



Tour Guide: PETER RAAB

Peter Raab is an associate professor at Texas Tech University in Lubbock and coordinator of the building technology sequence and graduate integrative design studios. Raab holds a Master of Architecture with a Specialization in Sustainable Design from The University of Texas at Austin, and a Bachelor of Design from the College of Architecture at The University of Florida. His research lies in cultural sustainability, where he investigates the phenomenology of place and the resonance of materials within architectural design. Raab has worked with prestigious architectural design firms such as Pritzker Prize-winning architect Foster & Partners in London, Burton Baldridge Architects in Austin, and Envision Design in Washington, DC, before founding Raab Architects in 2014. His interest in innovative architectural technology fosters more ecologically driven, material-conscious, and place-making with poetic architectonics to enhance the architectural experience. Raab has frequently led studios, students, and architects on tours of Dallas and Fort Worth over the past 20 years.
